## INFORMATIONAL WORKSHOP ON NEW HAMPSHIRE CURRENT USE TAX RULES

Rural landowners of 10 or more acres can enroll their property in the state "Current Use" program and lower their property taxes. However, property enrolled in Current Use has restrictions on its use, and a written management plan is required for forestland enrolled in the "stewardship" category.

This workshop is sponsored by the Town of New Hampton, UNH Cooperative Extension, and the Belknap County Conservation District. We will explain Current Use assessment and the different aspects of the program to help you decide if it is right for you. We will focus extra time on the more complex analysis involved in assessing the "farmland category." We will also give an update on any changes to Current Use regulations. If your land is already in Current Use, this will be a good refresher for you.
