Item #	Descriptions of Flowers Offered (see order form)
<b>01 Dutch Master Daffodil</b>	– Classic flower. Excellent for large landscaping jobs. Great for pollinators! Fragrant. Deer & rodent resistant. Full to partial sun. <b>Blooms:</b> April. <b>Height:</b> 14-16". <b>Zone:</b> 2-10.
<b>02 Narcissus Bunch Flower 'Blushing Lady'</b>	– Pale yellow flowers with apricot center. 6+ flowers per stem. Naturalizer. Pollinator friendly. Deer & rodent resistant. <b>Blooms:</b> Early-mid spring <b>Height:</b> 14" <b>Zone:</b> 4-9
<b>03 Narcissus Long-Lasting 'Holland Mixture'</b>	– Lovely white bloom mixture containing 5+ varieties of the major classes. Pollinator friendly. <b>Blooms:</b> Early-late spring <b>Height:</b> 18" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>04 Narcissus 'Butterfly Mix'</b>	– Stunning double centers, stripes, and frills that often resemble a butterfly. Deer resistant. Fragrant. Plant 12 bulbs per square foot. <b>Blooms:</b> Mid-spring. <b>Height:</b> 14-16" <b>Zone:</b> 2-10
<b>05 Mini Drumstick Allium 'Sphaerocephalon'</b>	– Petite, egg-shaped flower heads turn from green to purple as they mature. Pollinator friendly. <b>Blooms:</b> Late spring-early summer <b>Height:</b> 24" <b>Zone:</b> 4-7
<b>06 Grape Hyacinth (Muscari) 'Fantasy Creation'</b>	– Fluffy purple blooms. Sweet grape-like fragrance. Loved by pollinators, ignored by deer and rodents. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Mid spring <b>Height:</b> 8" <b>Zone:</b> 4-9
<b>07 Grape Hyacinth (Muscari) 'Atlantic'</b>	– Brilliant blue blooms with sweet fragrance. Loved by pollinators and ignored by deer & rodents. Naturalizer. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Mid spring <b>Height:</b> 8" <b>Zone:</b> 4-9
<b>08 Small Flowering Crocus 'Dorothy'</b>	– Tiny golden blooms accented by slender green leaves. Some of the first flowers to emerge. Great for borders and naturalizing. <b>Blooms:</b> Early spring <b>Height:</b> 4" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>09 Large Flowering Crocus Mix</b>	– Large blooms @ 3" in size. Colors white, yellow, & purple. Full sun-partial shade. Deer resistant. Attracts pollinators. Good in lawns. <b>Blooms:</b> Early spring. <b>Height:</b> 4-6" <b>Zone:</b> 3-9.
<b>10 Parrot Tulip 'La Courtine Parrot'</b>	– Feathery yellow petals that open completely in full sun splashed with green and thin red striping. Prefer protection from wind. <b>Blooms:</b> Late spring <b>Height:</b> 24" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>11 Darwin Hybrid Tulip 'World's Favorite'</b>	– Tallest class of tulips. Fiery bloom with bright red petals and a bold yellow frame. Wind & rain tolerant. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Mid to late spring <b>Height:</b> 18+" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>12 Double Early Tulip 'Columbus'</b>	– Early peony-like flowers that can withstand nasty Spring weather. Good for forcing & mass plantings, especially with Muscari. <b>Blooms:</b> Early spring <b>Height:</b> 14" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>13 Single Late Tulip 'Queen of Night'</b>	– Closest to true black a tulip can get. Great for cut flowers and mass plantings. Fragrant, pollinator friendly. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Mid-late spring <b>Height:</b> 24" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>14 Triumph Tulip 'Spryng Tide'</b>	– Intense raspberry-red with silver sheen to a deep ruby-red color. Strong stems and large blooms. Good for forcing. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> April/ May <b>Height:</b> 20" <b>Zone:</b> 3-7
<b>15 Camassia Quamash 'Esculenta'</b>	– AKA Wild Hyacinth. Rich dark blue variety that is slightly smaller than other Camassia. Great planted en masse. Full sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Late spring <b>Height:</b> 14" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8
<b>16 Hyacinth 'White Pearl'</b>	– Luminous snowy white spikes. Pollinator favorite but resists deer and rabbits. Splendid for naturalizing. Good for forcing. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Early-mid spring <b>Height:</b> 10" <b>Zone:</b> 4-8
<b>17 Hyacinth 'Gypsy Queen'</b>	– Salmon-apricot tinged pink petals. Dates back to 1927. Good for forcing. Naturalizes. Fragrant. Pollinator favorite. Full- part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Early spring <b>Height:</b> 10" <b>Zone:</b> 4-8
<b>18 Striped Squill 'Puschkinia Libanotica'</b>	– Fragrant, trouble free, inexpensive, and quite versatile. Pollinator friendly. Tolerates deer. Naturalizes. Full-part sun. <b>Blooms:</b> Early spring <b>Height:</b> 4" <b>Zone:</b> 4-7
<b>19 Fritillaria Meleagris Mix</b>	– AKA Checkered Lily. Dates back to 1575. Deer and rodent resistant. Naturalizer. Plant in borders at a focal point. Sun-part shade. <b>Blooms:</b> April/ May <b>Height:</b> 8" <b>Zone:</b> 3-8

**20 Glory of the Snow (Chionodoxa) 'Pink Giant'** – Deer resistant, easy to grow and great naturalizer. Full -part sun. **Blooms:** One of the first to bloom in early spring. **Blooms: Early spring Height: 14" Zone: 3-8**

**21 Leucojum aestivum 'Summer Snowflake'**- Showy bell-shaped flowers. Grows well and naturalizes in rich, well-drained soils. Tolerates deer. Full -part sun. **Blooms: Mid spring Height: 8-12" Zone: 3-9**

**22 Allium Tall 'Schubertii'** – Light up your garden with unique sparkler-like blooms. Vibrant and long lasting. Adds drama to flower arrangements. Full-part sun. **Blooms: Early summer Height: 16" Zone: 4-7**

**24 Iris Tall Bearded 'Over Alaska'** – Late bloom. Dark purple-black, slightly sweet fragrant iris. Drought tolerant. Cut flowers. Deer resistant. Full – part sun. **Blooms: Mid-late spring Height: 36" Zone: 3-10**

**25 Iris Tall Bearded 'Pink Attraction'**– Re-bloomer. Profuse, pretty pink. Drought tolerant. Deer resistant. Cut flowers. Full-part sun. **Blooms: Mid-late spring, may rebloom late summer Height: 30" Zone: 3-10**

**26 Hardneck Garlic 'Russian Red'** - Forms a ring of 5–12 large plump cloves around a central stalk. Keeps well for six+ months. Delicious garlic flavor with no bitter aftertaste. Harvest in late June/ mid-July.




Figure 1: Bulb planting chart. (Numbers in parentheses refer to minimum spacing.) Lilies normally are planted in the spring, while autumn crocuses normally are planted in midsummer. All other bulbs shown are planted in the fall. Planting depths are for well-drained soils. Bulbs do best in a sandy, clay loam. In heavier soils, plant 1 to 2 inches higher.
