Product Descriptions

Descriptions of Flowers Offered	
01) Daffodil Trumpet 'Dutch Master'	– Excellent for large landscaping jobs. Classic daffodil silhouette. Fragrant. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun, well-drained soils. Blooms mid spring. Full Height (Ht): 16-18"; Hardiness Zone (HZ): 2-10.
02) Daffodil Small Cupped 'Barrett Browning'	– White petals surrounding a small and slightly frilled orange/scarlet cup. Full sun to part shade. Drought tolerant Blooms mid-spring. Ht:18"; HZ: 3-8.
03) Daffodil Trumpet 'Mount Hood'	– Large blooms with pale yellow trumpet that fade to a creamy-white. Slightly fragrant. Full to partial sun. Blooms mid spring. Heirloom variety. Ht: 16-20"; HZ: 3-8.
04) Daffodil Large Cupped 'Pride of Lions'	– Golden-yellow petals surrounding large orange cup. Lightly fragrant. Tolerates heat and drought. Full sun to part shade. Blooms early to mid-spring. Ht: 18"; HZ: 3-8.
05) Crocus Large Flowering 'Blue Moon Mixture'	- Large blooms about 3" in size. Colors may consist of purple, blue, and white. Blooms early spring. Prefers full sun. Deer resistant. Attracts pollinators! Ht: 4-6"; HZ: 3-8.
06) Allium Tall 'Drumsticks'	- Excellent for rock gardens and mixed plantings. Deer resistant and pollinator friendly. Full to partial sun, well-drained soils. Blooms early-mid summer. Ht: 24-36"; HZ: 4-7.
07) Stripped Squill - (<i>Puschkinia Scilliodes 'Libanotica'</i>)	Multi stems of white to pale blue flowers with dark blue midveins. Deer resistant & rodent resistant. Enjoys light shade and moist, well-drained soils. Ht.: 8-10" HZ: 4-8
08) Hyacinth Orientalis 'Blue Jacket'	– Deep blue-purple, star shaped blooms with soft blue petal edges. . Can do well in containers. Blooms early spring. Full sun to partial shade. Ht: 0.5-1"; HZ: 4-8.
09) Hyacinth Orientalis 'Miss Saigon'	- Perfectly purple star-shaped blooms that are highly fragrant. Very attractive to pollinators. Deer resistant. Full sun to partial shade. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Blooms mid-spring. Ht: 0.5-1"; HZ: 4-8.
10) Muscari Grape Hyacinth 'Armeniacum'	– miniature, bell-shaped, cobalt blue flowers with a fine white border grow in clusters upon sturdy stalks. Hardy and easy to grow. When established it can bloom in spring and fall. Blooms mid-spring. Ht: 4-8; HZ: 3-9.
11) Camassia Quamash 'Esculenta'	- Tapering spikes of star-shaped, deep blue florets. Hardy. Full-partial sun. Prefers moist, well-drained soils. Native to northwestern U.S. Ht: 26"; HZ: 4-8.
12) Galanthus Single Snowdrop 'Woronowii'	- Pristine white flowers featuring a distinct green emblem. Blooms early spring. Full sun- part shade. Deer resistant. Attracts pollinators! Ht: 6-12"; HZ: 3-8.
13) Eranthis Cilicia 'Winter Aconite'	- Bright yellow cupped shaped blooms. Good naturalizer. Prefers humus-rich, well-drained soil. Deer resistant. Blooms in late winter. Full-partial sun. Ht:3-4"; HZ: 4-9.
14) Anemone Blanda 'Mixture'	– Beautiful mix of white, pink, and purple flowers. Deer resistant. Full to partial sun, and moist, well-drained soil. Blooms in early-mid spring. Ht: 4-6"; HZ: 4-9.
15) Tulip Parrot 'Parrot King'	- Large, golden-yellow fringed petals adorned with glowing orange, rose and green streaks. Blooms late spring. Well-drained soils. Full sun to mostly sunny. Ht: 14-16"; HZ: 3-8.
16) Tulip Single Late 'Queen of Night'	– Deep maroon-purple blooms with a smoky sheen, almost appearing black. Blooms mid-late spring. Prized for its weather resistance and forcing suitability. Sun to mostly sunny. Ht: 20-24"; HZ: 3-8.
17) Tulip Triumph 'Tom Pouce'	- Showstopper known for its large, bright pink petals with a creamy golden-yellow base. Sturdy stems. Blooms mid-spring. Full sun. Well drained soils. Ht: 18-20"; HZ: 3-8.

18) Tulip Double Late 'Double Surprise' - Full, peony style blooms in soft rose-pink brushed with creamy white highlights that deepen toward petal base. Bloom late spring. Full sun. Ht: 14-18"; HZ: 3-8.
19) Tulip Fringed 'Flamenco' – Large yellow fringed petals with bold red streaks. Sturdy stemmed. Ideal for mass plantings, containers, or borders. Blooms late-spring. Full sun. Ht: 20-22"; HZ: 3-8.
20) Fritillaria Meleagris Mixture – Lily–bell shaped blooms in deep purple, pink, and white. Checkered pattern adds a textured beauty. Naturalizes and often used in borders. Prefers humus-rich, moist, well drained soils. Deer and vole resistant. Blooms mid-spring. Thrives in part shade. Ht: 6-8"; HZ: 3-8.
21) Virginia Bluebells - Pink buds open to hanging, porcelain blue bell-shaped flowers. Native U.S. species prized by pollinators. Wonderful for under trees. Blooms mid-spring. Partial sun. Ht: 24-30"; HZ: 3-8.
22) Iris Germanica Bearded Iris 'Victoria Falls' – Reblooming iris with up to 14 flowers per stalk. Light blue ruffled petals with white signal patch in center. Deer resistant. Prefers well-drained, neutral to slightly alkaline soil. Full sun to part shade. Blooms early to late season. Ht: 40"; HZ: 3-10.
23) Iris Germanica Bearded Iris 'All Night Long' - Tall cultivar featuring near-black falls and intensely ruffled standards tinged with deep purple. Blooms in mid-late spring. Full sun. Ht: 31"; HZ: 3-10.
24) Fritillaria Imperialis 'Rubra Maxima' - AKA Crown Imperial. Creates a spectacular spring display. Reaches 3-4' tall. Orange-red bell-shaped blooms topped with green tufts. Good for borders or naturalized plantings. Musky smell. Deer resistant. Blooms mid-spring. Full to partial sun. Ht: 36"; HZ: 3-8.
25) Allium Giant 'Ambassador' XL – Towering ornamental onion with 6-8" flowers. Long lasting as cut flowers. Some drought tolerance. Deer resistant. Blooms late spring to early summer. Full to part sun. Ht: 36-48". HZ: 4-8.
26) Hardneck Garlic 'German Extra Hardy' - Exceptionally cold-hardy, hardneck porcelain variety produces large heads with 4–7 large cloves each. Classic garlic taste.
